Dear Partner in Ministry,

Things happening in multiples are keeping everyone busy and on their toes as we watch God at work. I thank you for your continued prayer and financial support which keeps things moving. When I made an appeal for help with purchasing Bibles, we received enough to buy one case (42 bibles) but we had twice that many children so by faith we purchased another case. We handed those out last week and there were still twenty-four children who didn't get Bibles. The funds are still coming in so we will take the remaining twenty-four Bibles this week.

We are also limited by the size of our compound (and budget) to having minimal play equipment for our children in our school. They have to rely on a swing, one basketball hoop, jump ropes, side walk chalk and running around the house for their activities. Recently however, one resourceful Mom, who used to be our next door neighbor for the past two years, returned to the U.S. with her family. She left part of her heart here and in an effort to meet some of the need she saw while here, had a birthday party for her pre-school son inviting all of his classmates requesting that instead of buying a gift, they make a donation to R.O.C.K. Ministries. The result of that ingenious idea was the provision to have a Merry-go-Round made and installed for the younger children in our school. We are in contact with a local Fundi so as funds permit; we will add more swings, monkey bars etc. to maximize the limited space we have.

God is also using faithful and obedient servants who are supplying funds for the continued construction at Malava. We have now started construction on the second house. The first week in July, I took our visitors from Germany to the property in Malava so they could see the progress being made. We spent the night in the one finished house, which is equipped with running water, flushing toilets and showers. We had two sets of bunk beds we had moved there previously so we were quite comfortable and enjoyed the peaceful surroundings and the beautiful country side. It was a good feel for what is soon to become a reality.

Please continue to pray with us for God's continued provision so we may continue with the construction and provide for the children in our home in Kisumu.
